

July 2, 1810




Birthday of Robert Augustus Toombs of Georgia, Confederate General and Secretary of State, Washington, Georgia


CSS <u>Tallahassee</u> commissioned as a commerce raider

At the June meeting, Camp 911 Commander Joe Clark presented Gus Grant with his membership certificate.




At the same meeting, Mack Lott was presented with a Meritorious Service Award from the Alabama Division SCV.

- 1. This Confederate naval officer, commander of CSS *Tallahassee*, escaped to Canada after the war and lived out the rest of his life there. Who was he?
- 2. Gen. Joseph E. Johnston sent a telegram to Lt. Gen. John C. Pemberton, who was commanding the defense of Vicksburg, telling him to take an action which Pemberton refused to take. What was it?
- 3. What Confederate politician advised against the attack on Fort Sumter, telling Jefferson Davis, "Mr. President, at this time it is suicide, murder, and will lose us every friend at the North. You will wantonly strike a hornet's nest which extends from mountain to ocean, and legions now quiet will swarm out and sting us to death. It is unnecessary; it puts us in the wrong; it is fatal."?
- 4. About how many soldiers, including Confederate and Union troops, were killed at Gettysburg? [a] 12,100, [b] almost 8000, [c] 4500, [d] over 14,000
- 5. The fall of Atlanta boosted Lincoln's popularity in the North and helped him win reelection in 1864. What Union general did he defeat in that election?
- 6. Who was general-in-chief of the U. S. Army at the time of the Battle of Gettysburg?
- 7. The surrender of what garrison gave the Union complete control of the Mississippi River?
- 8. What distinction did Col. Francis Barlow of Georgia earn at the First Battle of Manassas?
- 9. This 17th Century historic home, now in ruins, was of significance in three wars. Lafayette camped there during the American Revolution, as did Virginia militia in the War of 1812. It was also the site of a War Between the States battle. What is its name?
- 10. The Battle of the Crater was part of what larger military effort?

Henry Wager Halleck, who held the post July 1862-March 1864; (7) Port Hudson, Louisiana; (8) He was the first Confederate brigade commander to be killed in the war; (9) Malvern Hill; (10) the Siege of Petersburg.
